# 2010 Annual Report



2010 was a year of transition for Waycross. Like many businesses, governments and nonprofit organizations, we were tasked with operating with fewer resources.

I am happy to report that we were able to maintain our core service to our governments, schools, and residents. We did, however, have to cutback some of the educational services instituted by the board over the years.

The biggest operational change is that beginning with the 2010-2011 school year, we were no longer able to offer video classes at our high schools, and have had to eliminate the video clubs at the middle and high schools. As part of the re-structuring, we eliminated 4 staff positions, and made cuts elsewhere in the budget. I wish each of our former staffers well in their future employment - and thank our remaining staffers (and our volunteers!) for stepping up and maintaining the level of service our communities have come to expect.

We also were happy to welcome Colerain Township to the Waycross family in November. Watch for our cable channels to be activated there in March, 2011.

I would like to thank each of you - whether you are a volunteer, producer, board member, viewer, sponsor, community supporter, or elected official - for your continued support.

# History

Waycross Community Media opened its doors in 1982, serving the City of Forest Park, Village of Greenhills and Springfield Township, Ohio. Service to Colerain Township began in 2010. Waycross is a community-based media center providing coverage of community events, government meetings and school activities. All productions are crewed by community volunteers. Programming can be seen on Time Warner Cable and the internet.

Waycross also provides training and free equipment, facilities, and cablecasting for local residents interested in producing their own programs. Students in the Finneytown, Winton Woods, Northwest, and Mt. Healthy school districts are also encouraged to participate in Waycross classes and productions.

# Government Access

The Waycross Government Access Channel is operated on behalf of the governments of Forest Park, Greenhills and Springfield Township. Our mission - *To encourage the active participation of residents in the democratic process* - is achieved through the effective use of communication tools, providing our governmental bodies with the necessary resources to educate and inform residents on the various activities and issues – local, state and federal - that ultimately impact their quality of life.

## Government Meetings

Waycross cablecasts the council and trustees meetings from our three communities LIVE, then replays them throughout the month. Waycross cablecast every general council/trustee meeting held in 2010 (beginning in October for Colerain Township). In addition, Waycross videotaped for playback Winton Woods, Finneytown and Northwest School Board meetings, as well as the Hamilton County Public Library Board of Trustees meetings and Hamilton County Stormwater Oversight Board Meetings.

Waycross also provided 437 information and event listings sponsored by local, state and federal government agencies between programs on the Government Access bulletin board.

## Government Access Programming

Waycross produced 205 new government access programs, totaling 209 hours. In addition, Waycross cablecast 843 government programs produced by other agencies. These programs include *Army, Navy/Marine and Air Force News; Pentagon Channel programming; NASA programming; Cincinnati City Council; Hamilton County Commissioners; CMHA; National Guard Anti-Drug programming; LIVE Ohio House, Senate and Supreme Court sessions; U.S. Department of Health; Ohio Department of Public Health; Ohio Department of Aging and Ohio Bureau of Workers Compensation programming.*

# Educational Access

The Waycross Educational Access channel is operated on behalf of the educational institutions of Forest Park, Greenhills and Springfield Township. The mission - *To support and highlight the activities of our schools and to encourage the active participation of students in community media* - is achieved through the effective use of communication tools, providing our schools with the necessary resources to educate and inform residents.

## High School Classes

Waycross worked with students at Finneytown High School, for two courses in the spring semester. There were a combined total of 31 students in these classes.

## Boy Scout Merit Badge Week

Waycross served as counselors for the Cinematography, Communications and Photography merit badges in August, with 42 scouts participating. In addition, Waycross led three Cinematography sessions at Dan Beard Council's Merit Badge Challenge at Sycamore High school in February, with 45 scouts participating.

## Educational Access Programming

Waycross produced 279 new educational access programs, totaling 296 hours. In addition, Waycross cablecast 1026 educational programs from other sources. These programs include *Department of Education, Classic Arts Showcase, University of Cincinnati TV, University of California TV and Deutsch Welle.*

## Video Clubs and Summer Camps

Waycross continued to maintain video clubs at Winton Woods High and Middle Schools, Finneytown High and Middle Schools, Mt. Healthy Jr. High School and Home School. There were 29 students in the clubs in spring, 2010.

Waycross sponsored a summer day camp, teaching high and middle school students studio production, truck production, editing and portable production. There were 30 campers this year.

# Public Access

Waycross Community Media provides training, free equipment use and free cablecasting of programs produced by any resident or non-profit organization in our communities. In addition to scheduled workshops, our Training Coordinator offers additional one-on-one training sessions.

## Training

Waycross held 31 workshops/training sessions with 63 different participants. 58 people completed certification to use our equipment in 2010.

## Community Forum

*Community Forum* highlights the activities of local non-profit organizations.
